

Exhibit of Native Arts, at TVF

A large exhibit of Alaska Native Arts and Crafts will again be featured at the 1973 Tanana Valley Fair, August 15-19.

The first Native crafts show in Fairbanks was held at the 1961 Tanana Valley Fair, and has been continued since then.

Items such as beadwork, winter and summer clothing, baskets, dolls, jewelry, carving, and painting may be entered. Junior exhibitors 16 years of age and under may enter in a separate Junior section.

Exhibits are judged, and winning items receive ribbons and cash awards. First prize is a blue ribbon and \$3.00, second prize is a red ribbon and \$2.00, third prize is a white ribbon and \$1.00. Exhibits

placing fourth through seventh place receive ribbons only.

The most outstanding entry in both the adult and junior sections are designated as Grand Champions and receive a large Championship Purple Rosette. There are no cash awards with the champion or grand championship ribbons.

There is no charge for entering exhibits at the Fair. Interested persons should write or come to the Fair office for a Premium Book and Entry Blank. Persons living out of town may mail their entries to: Superintendent, Alaskan Native Arts & Crafts, Box 188, Fairbanks, Alaska 99701.

Please identify your exhibit with your name, address and

description of the item. Also include instructions for handling the exhibit following the Fair.

It may be returned to you, or taken to the Fairbanks Native Community Center for sale.

If an exhibitor wishes to have extra handicraft items sold at the Fair, they may be sold at the Farmers Market. Include instructions for selling and prices. 15% commission will be charged on sale items.
