Notice of Opportunity for Public Hearing

The North Slope Borough Public Works Department is proposing the construction of a new airport at Nuligut, Alaska. The proposed airport will be 5,000 feet long, 150 feet wide. To be constructed by the overlay embankment method utilizing sand and gravel from the bed of the Colville River, three miles southwest of the village.

Related improvements associated with this project include: a taxi way and parking apron; an access road connecting the village of Nuligut with the parking apron; runway and approach lighting; a non-directional beacon; and a support type building.

As a result of this project, it will be possible for all freight to come into Nuligut via new aircraft instead of by barge or cat train which are much more costly and hazardous to the environment. It will also provide for a safer and more consistent scheduled service than is currently provided on the existing landing area. The lands necessary for the airport and airspace protection is in the process of being conveyed to the North Slope Borough. No persons will have to be relocated as a result of the project.

Persons wishing to examine the preliminary plans and preliminary environmental assessment report for the project may do so during normal working hours at the North Slope Borough office at Barrow, Alaska.

Those persons in Nuligut who wish to examine the plans and environmental assessment report should contact the village council to find out where they are on public display.

Any person may request a public hearing for the purpose of considering the social, economic, and environmental effects of this project, and its consistency with such urban planning as has been carried out by the community.

Interested persons may request a public hearing by submitting a signed, written request to the North Slope Borough Public Works Department, P.O. Box 69, Barrow, Alaska 99723, on or before August 10, 1979.

If such a request is received, the North Slope Borough will conduct a public hearing at Nuligut on August 13, 1979.

Permissive Notice of Duck Island Unit Agreement and Expansion Request

On August 21, 1978, the Duck Island unit agreement was approved by the Deputy Commissioner of the Department of Natural Resources. This approval was granted after the Deputy Commissioner's determination that the unit plan of development and operation was necessary and advisable in the public interest for the purpose of more properly conserving natural resources. At the time of approval, the unit area covered the following described lands:

The Department of Natural Resources is a defendant in a pending lawsuit, Village of Kaktovik v. Robert E. LeResche, Civil No. 3AN-78-7331 (filed November 3, 1978). This suit was filed after the Duck Island unit application was approved. The State of Alaska has taken the position that AS 38.05.305 and AS 38.05.345 do not require notice to the public and an opportunity for public comment regarding state approval of unit designations and unit agreements by state oil and gas leaseholders. However, to accommodate the concerns of the plaintiffs, in the aforementioned lawsuit, notice is being given in this particular case on the basis that it is permissible for the state to provide this notice and an opportunity for public comment on the original Duck Island unit agreement. By giving this notice, the State does not waive any legal arguments in support of its position in the above-captioned lawsuit.

In addition, the Department of Natural Resources, through the Director, Division of Minerals and Energy Management (DMEM), hereby gives permissive notice that a request for expansion of the Duck Island Unit area has been submitted by the Unit Agreement. Preliminary approval of a portion of the lands requested was granted June 27, 1979. Comments are hereby requested from interested parties and members of the public on the area the state proposes to approve as logically subject to exploration and development under the unit agreement. The proposed expansion covers the following lands:

Based on the expansion request submitted on January 29, 1979, and on review of supporting geologic and engineering data and review of other materials and studies, the Director, DMEM, proposes to recommend approval of the proposed unit expansion subject to comments from other agencies, interested persons, and the public. In support of this proposed action, the Director, DMEM, has prepared a preliminary decision and findings. The Director concludes therein that the Duck Island Unit as expanded in the public interest, will result in exploration and development under unit plans without regard to lease boundaries and diverse ownership, enable coordination of development activities, avoid unnecessary duplication of facilities, centralize environmental control, have minimal impact on traditional uses of the land, conserve oil and gas resources, protect the interests of affected parties, and the state as lessor and royalty owner. The Director finds that approval of this expansion will not limit or diminish access to public or navigable waters beyond any limitations (if any) already contained in the oil and gas leases covered by the unit agreement.

Copies of the expansion request, the original unit agreement and the preliminary decision and findings prepared by the Director, DMEM, are available for public inspection at the offices of the Division of Minerals and Energy Management, 703 W. Northern Lights Blvd., Anchorage, Alaska. Copies of the application, as well as the preliminary decision and findings, will be available at cost.

Persons wishing to submit written comments concerning this unit agreement, the requested expansion thereof, and the Department's proposed action to approve the expansion must submit their comments to the Director on or before July 27, 1979. Under this notice, the state will review and consider all written comments and apply the standard of review mandated by the Administrative Procedure Act. The Director of the Division of Minerals and Energy Management will submit to the Commissioner, Department of Natural Resources, his recommendation for approval or disapproval of the proposed expansion and ratification of the original unit agreement. The Commissioner, Department of Natural Resources, will take action upon recommendations submitted by the Director within five (5) weeks from July 23, 1979.
