## Anaktuvuk Man Works for TAPS

The coming of TAPS to Alaska may mean many different things to the state's many citizens, but to one young man from Anaktuvuk Pass in north central Alaska, the event means a job, 12 hours a day, seven days a week.

Twenty seven year-old Riley Morry began working for TAFS Nov. 6 as an equipment time keeper.

The work required that he leave his wife and home in Anaktuvuk and live northwest of Fair banks in Livengood with other employes preparing the road bed for the pipeline.
The line is to stretch nearly 800 miles from Prudhoe Bay in
