PERIOD FROM SEPTEMBER 24, 1978 THROUGH OCTOBER 10, 1978] NO LATER
THAN OCTOBER 13, 1978. THE 10 DAY POST-ELECTION REPORT MUST BE
POSTMARKED TO THE ALASKA PUBLIC OFFICES COMMISSION NO LATER THAN
OCTOBER 13, 1978. PLEASE DO NOT FILE THE REPORT WITH YOUR MUNICI-
PAL CLERK. MUNICIPAL GROUPS ARE SUBJECT TO THE SAME REPORTING
DEADLINES.

STATE CANDIDATES OR GROUPS

STATEWIDE CANDIDATES, AND CANDIDATES RUNNING FOR STATE HOUSE OR SENATE
SEATS ARE REQUIRED TO SUBMIT THEIR 30 DAY PRE-GENERAL ELECTION REPORTS
[COVERING THE PERIOD FROM AUGUST 30, 1978 THROUGH OCTOBER 6, 1978] NO
LATER THAN OCTOBER 9, 1978. THESE REPORTS MUST BE POSTMARKED TO THE
ALASKA PUBLIC OFFICES COMMISSION NO LATER THAN OCTOBER 9, 1978. GROUPS
SUPPORTING OR OPPOSING BALLOT ISSUES, POLITICAL PARTIES, AND OTHER
GROUPS CAMPAIGNING IN THE GENERAL ELECTION ARE SUBJECT TO THE SAME
REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.

IF YOU ARE A STATE OR MUNICIPAL CANDIDATE, OR A GROUP, AND YOU HAVE
HAD NO CONTRIBUTION OR EXPENDITURE ACTIVITY SINCE FILING YOUR LAST
REPORT, SIMPLY COMPLETE BOTH SIDES OF APOC FORM 15-3AS (State) or
15-3AM (Municipal) AND MAIL THAT ONE PAGE TO THE COMMISSION'S ANCHORAGE
OFFICE.

SMALL GRANTS PROGRAM

Congress has authorized the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE)
to undertake a small grants program in support of small-scale energy-
related technologies, referred to as Appropriate Technologies because

The purpose of these grants is to develop energy-related projects

authorities
- Alaska Native villages or regional corporations
- Small businesses
