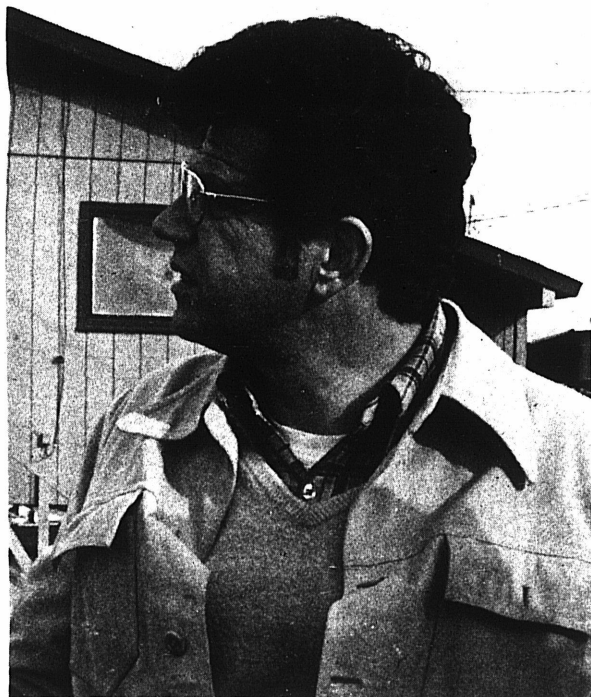


It's Going To Be A Long, Cold, Expensive Winter In Rural Alaska
