**IN THE
REGULATION OF THE
ALASKA COMMERCIAL
FISHERIES ENTRY COMMISSION**
Notice is hereby given that the Alaska Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission, under authority vested by AS 6.43.020 and AS 16.43.101, proposes to adopt, amend and repeal regulations in Title 20, Chapter 5 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement and interpret AS 16.05 and AS 16.43, as follows:

- (1) to provide that a holder of a permit may be required to produce personal identification;
- (2) to provide that 20% of other crab species may be taken by a holder of a valid permit for King, Tanner or Dungeness crab;
- (3) to provide that Abalone is added to the Fishery Resource Code;
- (4) to provide more specificity in the Gear Code;
- (5) to provide a new fee schedule based on permit type;
- (6) to adopt a rebuttable presumption of the ability to actively participate in the fisheries;
- (7) to provide a method to apply for and furnish information about Educational Entry Permits;
- (8) to establish requirements for educational permit gear operators;
- (9) to provide for the reporting and payment of income by educational entry permit holders;
- (10) to establish that all permits cannot be assigned and must be transferred through the Commission;
- (11) to provide for the transfer and reissuance of entry permits when the transfer involves loan activity by the State of Alaska;
- (12) to establish, subject to a rebuttable presumption, that certain permit transactions are pursuant to a lease or retained right of repossession;
- (13) to provide for the designation of agents by the Commission for the purpose of processing state loans for permits;
- (14) to provide for the emergency transfers of interim-use and entry permits;
- (15) to provide for the transfer of entry permits after the death of the holder;
- (16) to establish the right to request an administrative hearing to contest a Commission determination under secs. 700-750 of Chapter 5;
- (17) to provide definitions for terms used in these proposed regulations;
- (18) to provide for Commission determination of appraised values of entry permits.
