

State Airports to Benefit from Fund

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 26—Alaska will receive an allocation of \$5,030,365 for improvement of the Anchorage, Ketchikan, Bethel and Homer Airports under the Federal Aid Airport program for fiscal year 1969 according to word received by Senator Gruening from the United States Department of Transportation.

A total of \$3,074,700 will be spent on the stage two site preparation for a new parallel runway and associated taxiways at Anchorage.

Ketchikan will receive \$1,006,775 for site preparation and development on its new airport.

Bethel will receive \$503,

005 for extending and widening its runway and taxiway and extending its aprons.

Homer will receive \$45,885 for extending and seal coating its runway and improving its runway lighting.

Only the States of Calif. and Texas will receive larger allocations than Alaska during fiscal year 1969.
