

I think Alaska Pacific is terrific!

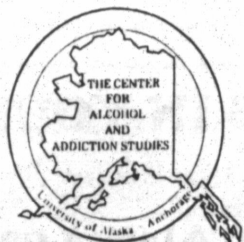
