

Fiddlers show to be aired

The video documentary of Athabascan Old Time Fiddlers titled "The Metal That Sings" will air statewide over public television stations and village satellite television stations on April 12, 1984 at 8 p.m.

The majority of the 28 minute documenting the music and history of Athabascan fiddlers was taped during the "Athabascan Old Times Fiddling Festival" held in Fairbanks in November. The festival, the first of its kind, recongnized the unique style of fiddling music that Athabascan people have developed.

The fiddling festival was a project of the Alaska State Council on the Arts presented by the Institute of Alaska Native Arts, a statewide arts organization with not-for-profit status which advocates for Aleut, Eskimo and Indian artists and their work through a number of programs which address the needs and requests for assistance for literary, performing, and visual artists.
