

AFN human resources board meeting

The AFN Human Resources Board met on April 2 and seated two new members: Caleb Pungawiyi, representing Kawerak, Inc., and Tom Craig, representing Copper River Native Association.

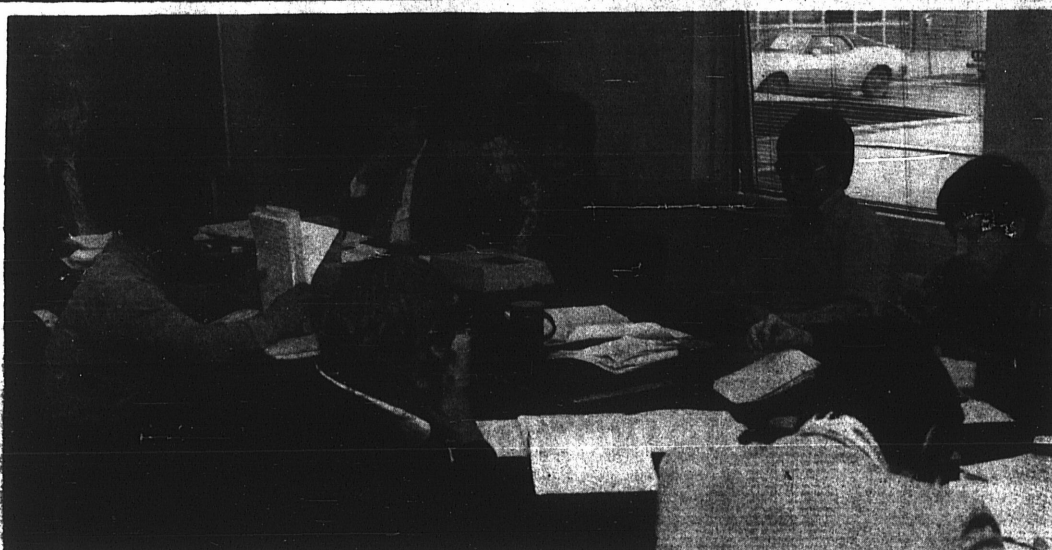
After the adoption of the January 10, 1979 HRC Board minutes and the agenda, Bill Peratovich, a member of Task Force II, JOM Funding, discussed the funding formula.

He said that there are six options to look at but that option C would be best because we'd receive more money, \$75 million, which would work out to about \$806 per student.

On May 14, ballots listing the various options will be distributed to all tribes in the U.S. and the results tabulated by June 8, 1979. Mr. Peratovich was approved by the Board to be their representative concerning these matters.

Gordon Jackson presented some information on Indian Education funding through the state. As a result, the Chairman requested that the AFN staff investigate the methods used to track State Indian Education funds, and State distribution of P.L. 874 funds. He also requested that they meet with DPDP on rural education policy.

Other items that were included on the agenda were: the subsistence definition of non-commercial harvest, the 1980 Status Report (a motion by Ray Paddock, Tlingit-Haida, suggesting that AFN advocate for a Native American Advisory Commission to be established by the Bureau of Census with the inclusion of Hawaiian Natives was approved by unanimous vote), the HUD 1980 budget reduction and Coastal Zone Management.
