Dr. Van de Velde to Give Microscopy Instruction

Dr. Robert L. Van de Velde, Chief of the Department of Anatomy at the Cedars of Lebanon-Sinai Hospitals in Los Angeles, is in Fairbanks for three weeks of formal and informal instruction in microscopy.

Sponsored by the University of Alaska and the Arctic Health Research Center of the U.S. Public Health Service, Dr. Van de Velde will serve as a Visiting Professor in Electron Microscopy at the Geophysical Institute.

A presentation for the general public will be offered at 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday, January 20 at the Arctic Health Research Center. Dr. Van de Velde's topic that night will be "The Application of Modern Microscopic Techniques in the Study of Disease."

This will be preceded by a seminar on January 8 on the "Preparation of Tissue Samples for Electron Microscopy", to be conducted on campus for scientists and technicians engaged in research in the biological and medical fields.

An evening course on "Tissue Preparation for Microscopy" will be offered without charge at 7:30 p.m. on January 12-14, 18, 19, 21 at the Arctic Health Research Center, and is open

to all interested persons.

The course will include methodology in tissue preparation for both light and electron microscopy and will consist of one-hour lectures and demonstrations.

Practical experience in the preparation of tissues for light and electron microscopy can be provided for a limited number of persons following the lecture-demonstrations.

Advance registration is not required for the lectures and there is no fee for the non-credit course.

Repeated Failures Due to Bad Weather—

Air Force Tried Hard to Get Santa to Anaktuvuk Pass, But

The children of Anaktuvuk Pass, a small village of about 120 Eskimos will have to wait till another year to meet Santa Claus. After repeated failures, the Air Force gave up its attempts to bring Santa and a load of Christmas presents to the isolated village.

After Santa's fifth attempt (the second to get off the ground) turned back on December 28 when the landing gear on the C123 cargo plane would not go up, Air Force officials decided many of the fruits and perishables in the cargo might spoil if they waited to try again.

A prior attempt was turned back the day after Christmas, when high winds made it impossible to land a plane in the village.

The Christmas goods were sent to Bettles, according to Air Force Sergeant William Crouch. From there, people going back and forth to Anaktuvuk Pass will hopefully ferry in the toys, clothing, fruit, candy, and tobacco.

During the week before Christmas, three scheduled attempts to send Santa Claus to Anaktuvuk Pass were frustrated.

Lt. Col. John A. Zimmerman, Chief of Base Operations and Training for the 5010th Combat Support Group at Eielson AFB promised the children in the village when he was there last to bring them Santa Claus for Christmas.

Colonel Zimmerman has been periodically flying contributions from the base Thrift Shop into the isolated village, whose air strip is its only contact with the outside world.

These contributions include clothing, useful articles and toys for the children of the village.

Anaktuvuk Pass, lined by the Brooks Mountains, is about 560 miles north-northwest of Fair-

banks, 120 miles north of the Arctic Circle.

The village sits in the main route of a wind tunnel through the mountains. Wind speeds often go over 50 mph.
