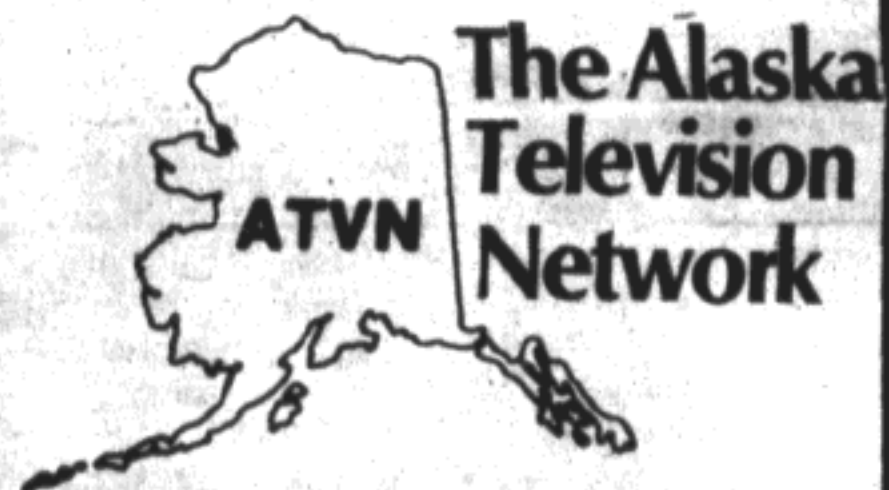

The Job Corps is for young men and women ages 16 to 21, who are out of school, unemployed and willing to leave Alaska for 6 months to 2 years of valuable skills training.

Job Corps Centers are located in Washington, Oregon, and Idaho and offer training in auto mechanics, carpentry, heavy equipment operation, masonry, forestry, clerical and secretarial positions, dental assistance, and many others. While at the center, young people can also earn a high school diploma or GED.

All Job Corps members are provided free transportation, medical/dental care, and even monthly spending money. Corpsmembers are eligible for a paid two-week leave to return to their homes in Alaska.

Upon completion of training, Job Corps graduates receive assistance in locating and finding jobs with good futures.
