
Doyon Has New Leader

Tim Wallis of Fairbanks has been elected president of Doyon, Ltd. He was elected at a recent meeting of Doyon's Board of Directors. Wallis succeeds Emil Notti whose resignation was announced in January.

Wallis said he expects 1980 to be a good year for the Interior Native regional corporation. "I expect Doyon to become more aggressive in seeking out investment opportunities," Wallis said, "and it will be a year for further planning."

Wallis, an Athabascan born in Ft. Yukon, served as President of Doyon, Ltd. in 1976-1977. He is currently chairman of Doyon's Board of Directors, a position he intends to relinquish at the annual Shareholders' Meeting, March 14.

Notti's resignation will take effect March 15. The three weeks prior to his departure are serving as a transition period for the new president.
