

Nationwide Confab— Indian Women to Meet

MARQUETTE, Mich.—American Indian women from throughout the United States and Canada will meet next June on the campus of Northern Michigan University for their fifth annual conference.

Mrs. Agnes Dill, Isleta, N.M., president of the North American Indian Women's Association, said that Northern has been selected as the site of the conference, scheduled for June 12-15.

Beatrice LaBine, Trout Creek, and Florence Uusitalo, Baraga, co-chairpersons of the regional planning group responsible for coordinating the conference, said that approximately 1,000 women are expected to register for the four-day event.

This is the first time the NAIWA parley will be held in the Great Lakes area. Last year's meeting was in Sisseton, S.Dak.

Ranking federal, state and regional officials will address the conference, which will include workshops, a pow wow and other social and recreational activities in the Marquette area.

A special event will be a fashion show featuring Native American dress from throughout the continent.

NAIWA is a non-profit educational association, organized for the purpose of promoting improvement in five basic areas of Indian life.

These are: betterment of home, family life and community; betterment of health and education; inter-tribal communications; awareness of Indian culture, and fellowship among all people.

Aleutian Is.'s Area Checked For Fisheries

A study of the suitability of several streams in the Umnak-Unalaska Islands area for a salmon fishery rehabilitation program will be made possible through a \$25,500 grant by the Economic Development Administration to the Aleut League.

An additional \$9,450 will be provided by the Aleut League to supplement funding of the 14-month field study, according to an announcement by the agency.

Work is to include examination of possible sites for gravel incubation systems for both commercial and subsistence salmon fishery restoration. The proposed project was reviewed and endorsed by the Alaska Department of Economic Development.

Contributions Deductible

ANCHORAGE — Contributions made during 1974 to a political candidate or campaign committee may qualify for a deduction or credit against federal income tax, Charles E. Roddy, IRS District Director for Alaska, said recently.

For qualified political contributions, the tax law permits an itemized deduction of up to \$50 (\$100 on a joint return) or a credit that will reduce your tax by one-half of the contribution up to \$12.50 (\$25 on a joint return) Roddy said.

"Taxpayers can claim the credit even if they take the standard deduction," Roddy said. "On the other hand, to claim a deduction for a campaign contribution, they must itemize all deductions," he added.

"In addition to cash paid directly to a candidate or committee, political contributions that qualify for the deduction or credit include tickets to political fund-raising dinners and parties devoted primarily to political speeches or discussion," Roddy said. "However, raffle tickets purchased in connection with political fund-raisers do not qualify for the deduction or credit."

Roddy pointed out that taxpayers should keep records such as a written receipt or a canceled check to substantiate the deduction.
