

Brown appointed to judicial panel

The Alaska Judicial Council announced recently that it has appointed Harold M. Brown to serve as the council's executive director.

Brown, the state's attorney general under Gov. Bill Sheffield, graduated from Boston University Law School in 1968. He has worked as the district attorney in Ketchikan and was in private practice in Ketchikan for 11 years with the firm that is now Ziegler, Cloudy, King and Peterson. He also was president of the Alaska Bar Association for the 1984-85 term.

The council nominates candidates to the governor for judicial appointment under a merit selection system, and it conducts research.
