Thanks to the ice here after strong wind from southwest arises and smashed one building of native here. Strong wind was almost like the one we have in 1963 when few buildings that year been washed in and some collapsed. The time when lot of us moved over to church and school.

We're pretty sure it would do the same to the buildings if ice wasn't around. Reason was I say thanks is, I was one of them that year 1963, that do lost my building or lodging.

While the Paniktuk (Oogruk dried meat) for sale, here's your

Youngsters here in Barrow are practicing in high kicking, both feet and one foot kick.

I suppose next coming Eskimo Olympics deal, they will want to go down and partake some of this kicking. It's very early, but they still at it.

late this fall or may not come as our Arctic ice is along shore everywhere. Hope not, we want North Star III in.
