STATE OF ALASKA PUBLIC NOTICE of WETLANDS and FLOODPLAIN INVOLVEMENT

Pursuant to Presidential Executive Orders 11990, Protection of Wetlands, and 11988, Floodplain Management, the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities provides notice of proposal to place embankment material in wetlands and floodplains of the Tununak River at the Tununak River Bridge. The proposed project requires the placement of sheetpile walls around the bridge abutments and causeway. Additional support would be provided to the walls by gabion baskets and clean granular material.

The proposed structures and embankment are required to prevent further subsidence of the bridge abutments and erosion surrounding the concrete pads supporting the bridge beams. The proposed improvements would provide a safe and reliable access road and eliminate any future bridge wash-out from winter storms.

Quantities of embankment material have yet to be determined. Approximately 0.2 acres of wetlands and floodplains would be involved.

The floodplain encroachment would not cause flood-related impacts to homes or businesses and would not alter water elevation during high water periods. The proposal would not be directly or indirectly incompatible to floodplain or wetland development.

There are no practical alternatives to the proposed construction within the wetland and floodplain. Means to mitigate detrimental effects of the project on wetlands and floodplains will be implemented as required.
