OMBUDSMAN ASSISTANT. The office of the Ombudsman is accepting applications for the position of Ombudsman Assistant I for the Fairbanks office. The duties of the Ombudsman Assistant include interviewing complainants, collecting information and data about complaints, interviewing state agency personnel to ascertain agency policy, analyzing regulations and policy memoranda of specific state agencies, resolving cases, and preparing recommendations concerning the resolution of complaints. The person appointed is expected to manage a significant case load under constraints of limited time and resources.

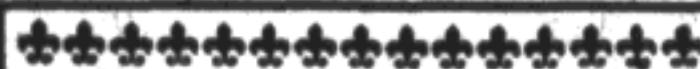
