NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION

Notice is hereby given that the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation under authority vested by AS 46.03.020(10)(E), AS 46.03.100(a), AS 46.03.110, AS 46.03.120, AS 46.03.810, and AS 46.03.820, proposes to amend the regulations in Title 18 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with Solid Waste Management, to implement AS 46.03, as follows:

- * Reorganize format to departmental standards;
- * Repeal requirements no longer considered necessary and requirements adequately addressed by other regulatory programs;
- * Clarify technical and procedural requirements;
- * Adopt new or modified requirements more appropriate to current technology and Alaskan conditions;
- * Adopt new administrative options to reduce permit issuance delays and improve administrative responsiveness to special situations;
- * Adopt updated definitions that utilize current terminology; and
- * Repeal all parts of 18 AAC 60 previously adopted.
