

RDA Grants \$5,000-

To Replace Kotzebue Transmitter

JUNEAU — Governor William A. Egan said the state Rural Development Agency has approved a \$5,000 grant to help pay for replacing a transmitter building destroyed by fire at a new public broadcasting radio station at Kotzebue.

A nighttime fire burned the transmitter facility only a few days after the new station, KICE, went on the air early this month. Egan said villages from sur-

rounding areas and Kotzebue residents are holding fund-raising projects to help pay for replacing the equipment.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 82 acres of clearing and grubbing; 800,000 cubic yards of unclassified excavation; 320,000 tons of borrow; 110,000 cubic yard miles of haul and 410,000 ton-miles of haul; 1,800 cubic yards of structure excavation; 41,000 tons of crushed aggregate base; 60,000 tons of subbase A; 13,000 tons of hot asphalt pavement; 781 tons of A.C. 200-300 and 155 tons of MC-30; approximately 282 cubic yards of Class A concrete; 56,000 pounds of re-steel; and 183,000 pounds of structural steel, lump sum, all required; 640 linear feet of metal bridge railing; 620 linear feet of structural steel piles; 1,600 linear feet of 24" pipe conduit; 500 linear feet of beam type guard rail; 14,000 tons of Class II riprap and 14,000 tons of pit run riprap; 1,754,000 square feet of seeding; painted traffic marking, lump sum, all required; telephone line adjustments, lump sum, all required; and miscellaneous items of work.

All work shall be completed in 330 calendar days.
