JUNEAU – Effective May I, the Main Post Office, Airport Post Office and College Station Post Office will sell food coupons from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday.

During May, food stamp recipients will have the option of buying food coupons at either the above mentioned post offices or from the Native Welcome Center, 102 Lacey Street. After June 1, anyone wishing to purchase food coupons must buy them from the U. S. Postal Service. Only coupons purchased by mail will be sold from the Family and Children Services district offices after that date.

A time schedule for selling the food coupons at the post office has been set from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Friday, the new method of selling food coupons will be implemented at Juneau and Ketchikan on the same date. The state began using post offices as food coupon distribution centers approximately a year ago in Anchorage and has succeeded in offering better service to recipients by increasing sales hours, having trained cashiers to handle the sales, offering better services at the District offices by having more time to work with clients, and by developing more effective accounting methods in handling the sales.

the sales. Post offices will be involved with selling food coupons only. Anyone wishing to apply for food stamps, having questions about the program, wanting to register complaints or request hearings will need to contact the Family and Children Services district office.

When buying food coupons at the post office, recipients will be required to take a valid authorization to purchase form and identification card with them.
