

## FIRST BLM SURVEY CONTRACT UNDER LAND CLAIMS

ANCHORAGE — One of the first rectangular survey assignments awarded to a private firm by the Bureau of Land Management for village withdrawals under provisions of the Native Land Claims Settlement Act was recently completed by Borhhoff & Associates, Inc., a professional engineering and surveying firm in Anchorage, Alaska. The Native Land Claims Settlement grants 40 million acres of land to an estimated 55,000 Natives of Alaska. The survey, performed on behalf of an Eskimo village, required the Bomhoff ciew to cover some 300 square miles of North Slope tundra during three weeks of Alaska's brief and chilly Arctic summer.
