Can! Eliza Jone's pioneering career, as the first Northern Athabaskan Indian to undertake technical linguistic studies, has set an example for others to emulate. Her enthusiastic participation in workshops across Alaska has been instrumental in producing culturally sensitive and linguistically accurate secondary school curricula throughout the stat. Through her efforts, the lives of Koyukon Athabascan people and all Alskans will be enriched for generations to come. Eliza Jones received an honorary degree of Doctor of Letters in 1990
