NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

Notice is given that the State Board of Education, under the authority of AS 14.07.080 and 14.11.130, proposes to adopt or amend regulations of the Department of Education in Title 4 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with property insurance and school construction as provided herein.

Regulations are proposed for adoption as 4 AAC 31.300 through 4 AAC 31.325 to implement mandatory property insurance programs, required by AS 14.03.180, for all school districts in the state. The regulations will address the following issues:

(1) 4 AAC 31.300 establishes general requirements for insurance or programs of self insurance for school districts.

(2) 4 AAC 31.305 establishes criteria by which programs of self insurance may be judged.

(3) 4 AAC 31.310 establishes deductible amounts required for insurance policies purchased by school districts and the requirements for cash reserves to fund the deductible.

(4) 4 AAC 31.315 establishes the requirement that the proceeds paid upon the damage to or destruction of the school facility shall be used to repair or replace the building.

(5) 4 AAC 31.320 establishes standards for proof of insurance.

(6) 4 AAC 31.325 establishes the limits of insurance and the deductible if the state purchases insurance for a school district after a school district fails to do so, and the method by which the state will procure insurance.

Regulations are also proposed for adoption, amendment, or repeal to implement and interpret AS 14.11.006-14.11.017 and AS 14.11.100. These regulations will address the following issues:

(1) 4 AAC 31.011 relating to planning of educational facilities is proposed for amendment to implement new planning requirements found in AS 14.11.011.

(2) 4 AAC 31.020 is proposed for amendment as appropriate to incorporate revised guidelines for planning, construction and equipping of school facilities.

(3) 4 AAC 31.021 is proposed for adoption to establish the procedures and documentation requirements relating to applications for grants for school construction.

(4) 4 AAC 31.022 is proposed for adoption to establish the criteria under which the department will review grant applications and rank projects eligible to receive grants for the next fiscal year.

(5) 4 AAC 31.023 is proposed for adoption to establish conditions which attach to an award grant for school construction.

(6) 4 AAC 31.025 is proposed for adoption to establish appeal procedures for school districts which are aggrieved by the department's actions taken on their grant applications.

(7) 4 AAC 31.066 is proposed for amendment to establish procedure for the selection of consultants necessary to plan, design, or construct school facilities with money provided either as a grant under AS 14.11.030, as reimbursement under the provisions of AS 14.11.100.

(8) 4 AAC 31.080 is proposed for repeal and redaction to require competitive bidding for the construction of school facilities paid for with money provided either as a grant under AS 14.11.020 or reimbursement under AS 14.11.100.
