

Murphy to Students—

'Get Involved in Politics'

"Get involved in politics. It is a duty and an obligation young people owe their nation for the privileges of living in America!" Such was the advice Sen. George L. Murphy, R. Calif., gave to more than 100 University students listening to him Sunday afternoon during a special "Sound Off" program in the Student Union cafeteria.

Sen. Murphy's "Get Involved" advice came in response to a student question concerning the best way for young people to get the facts about what is going on in government.

It came as the climax to more than a half hour of definitive and pertinent question and answer exchange between students and speaker.

Obviously at ease with his young audience, Senator Murphy welcomed questions on a variety

of subjects and shared bits of his own youthful experiences as a college student with his listeners.

Following the "Sound Off" appearance, Senator Murphy moved up to the KUAC studio where he taped a fifteen minute interview with Scott Loll, a student announcer.

With his party, Sen. Murphy

then visited the University museum and the Musk Ox farm before going to International Airport to enplane for California.
