Young Proposes Surface Routes to Yukon-Kandik

Alternate surface routes to expedite the movement of freight to the Yukon-Kandik oil fields are suggested by Donald Young, Republican member of the state house of representatives from the 16th district, as a result of research into transportation problems of the area.

Young proposes activation of a surveyed road route from Circle Hot Springs east to Eagle to connect the Steese highway with the Taylor highway as one means of access to the Kandik. His alternate surface route would involve the water route from Nenana to Circle, via the Tanana and Yukon rivers.

"These two routes would open up the Kandik to various types of development, insure all

weather access to the area for transportation of equipment and supplies and also open up a

circular route to the development of tourism." Young declared.

At about 3:30 p.m. yesterday, Sam Taalak said that the village was to have a meeting to map out plans of rescue and search.

"They are going to try to save the men and to heck with the whale is what I think," said Sam Taalak.

"The whale was about the size that Allen Rock caught at Point Hope in 1961—about 60 tons. That's quite a monster," said Taalak.

At his last report to Tundra Times after 4:00 p.m. yesterday, Sam Taalak said that the search planes were not able to locate Joash Tukle and his crew.

"There's no trace of them from the air and the people are worried here," he said.

He said emergency meeting was in progress at that time. The people had decided to call Search and Rescue units from Fairbanks and elsewhere to help search for the lost whalers.

to rise and the value of the dollar continues to diminish," he said, charging that even the government programs to help alleviate poverty were ineffective—in spite of his efforts.

"I spent four years trying to get the war on poverty to the poor people," he added, but claimed he was not succeeding.

Sharing the platform with Senator Murphy was Elmer Rasmuson, Republican candidate for Senator from Alaska. Also speaking briefly was Congressman Pollock who served as master of ceremonies.

Each Republican candidate for state office was introduced and made brief remarks.

The keynote speaker, Senator Murphy, also touched on the Vietnam war. He said that the United States is there for our own best interests—but that the war has not been won because the military men have not been given a chance.

Whether to bomb or not to bomb," he said, "is an important question—but not the only one."

He insisted that the Democratic administration has used this question to cover up the "mess that is in Washington," referring to the budget which he claimed is 25 billion out of balance. "One day," he concluded, "somebody must balance those books."

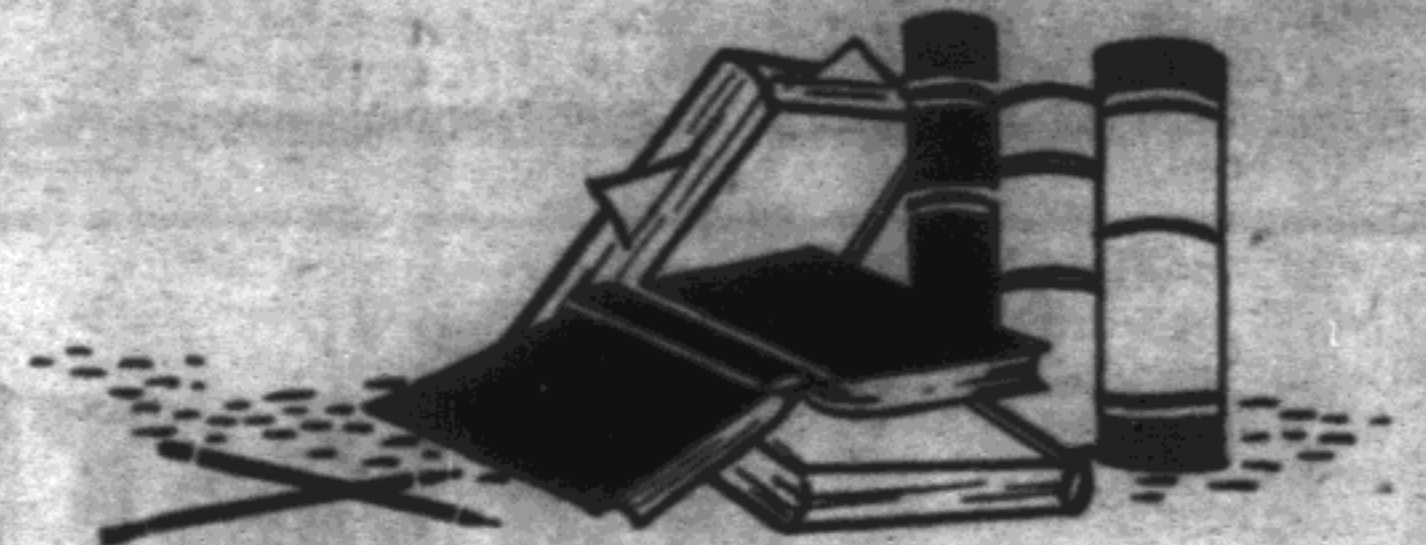

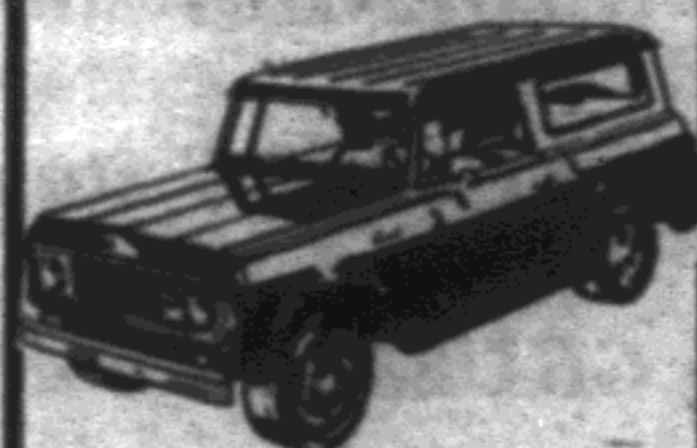
