New Uses For Ex-Boarding Home Funds Sought

Recently the Johnson O'Malley advisory board left the State in a quandary by deciding that the Federal funds given under the Johnson O'Malley Act could not legally be used for Boarding Home Program.

The BHP is a necessary part of basic education, and the State should be responsible for it. A court injunction was obtained to keep the State from using the funds for Boarding

Home Program until a final legal determination is made.

This put the State in a hot-spot. If Johnson O'Malley funds can't be used, how will they pay for the expensive Boarding Home Program? At present, that is the State's big problem.

In the meantime, the Advisory Board must look for other ways to spend the Johnson O'Malley funds. These funds are supposed to be spent on special projects in education. A meet-

ing will be held in Anchorage, July 20, to consider alternate proposals.

One way the funds might be spent is to expand the foreign studies program, in which students spend part of a year studying in a foreign country.

Much of the money for students in this program already came from Boarding Home Program funds, indirectly from Johnson O'Malley monies.

Another use for the funds currently under study by Tanana Chiefs, is establishment of a special center for teaching of traditional Athabaskan ways and cultural heritage.

This center might be located presently in one village or location, then later expanded into workshops which could be carried to many villages. Students would be primarily of the high school and just out of high school ages.

Other alternate uses for the money might be in expansion of educational television services throughout the rural areas. Community colleges in small cities is also a possibility.
