"The higher amount will continue to be charged until the premium record for each beneficiary can be corrected," Brodigan said.

"Refunds in full will be made at a later date. This also applies to Railroad Retirement Beneficiaries and Civil Service Annuitants who pay premiums for medical insurance under Medicare."
