Committee members present represented the five villages currently being served: Manley, Ruby, Tanana, Galena, and Nulato. Other villages in the region include Bettles, Allakaket, Alatna, Hughes, Huslia, Koyukuk, Kaltag, and, Minto.

Other representatives present were Frank and Diane Gurtler of Manley, Morris McGinty of Nulato, and Max Huhndorf and Elma Gillette of Galena.

It was voted to send a telegram to state senator John Sackett, Dr. Ferguson, acting president of the University of Alaska and Dr. Hugh Fate and Sam Kito of the University Board of Regents requesting an additional \$250,000 for the upcoming year to fulfill the needs of the eight villages currently not being serviced

due to lack of funds.
