Alaska Board of Fish and Game, under authority vested by Alaska Statutes 16.05.250, proposes to adopt, amend or repeal regulations contained in Title 5 of the Alaska Administrative of Title 16. Alaska, Statutes

Regulations to be the subject of Joard action are in chapters 03, 06, 9, 12, 18, 21, 24, 30, 33, and 39, Title 5, Alaska Administrative Code, concerning commercial fishing and chapters 51, 57, and 72, Title 5, Alaska Administrative Code, concerning sport fishing.
The Board of Fish and Game will adopt, amend or repeal, or take no action, on the proposed changes in regulations as listed in the following informative summary:
