Positions Announcement
The North Slope Higher Education Center (NSHEC) is a recently created institution, with its administrative offices in Barrow, Alaska. The NSHEC will provide post-high school academic education, and will develop a range of university accredited in-service, certificate and degree programs that will help meet the educational needs of the North Slope residents.

It is called the North Slope Higher Education Center, because, at present, it does not have independent status as an accredited institution of higher education. However, for academic purposes, it has its status as an affiliate of the University of Alaska-Fairbanks (UAF). All academic credits, certificates, programs and degrees would come through the UAF. The NSHEC would have the accreditation of the UAF and therefore, must satisfy the academic standards of the UAF. As a goal, the NSHEC will maintain such a satellite accreditation relationship until some point in the future, when it will seek its own independent accreditation. The NSHEC is an autonomous management unit of the North Slope Borough under the control of the North Slope Higher Education board.

The North Slope Borough, with its 88,000 square miles of territory and approximately 9,000 people, occupies most of the Alaskan Arctic. It is the largest regional municipality in the United States and encompasses eight Inupiat villages, as well as the Prudhoe Bay/Kuparuk petroleum complexes.

The NSHEC is seeking applications for four faculty positions. All faculty will live in Barrow, but frequent travel to the other villages will be required. Faculty should have multiple interests and expertise, a commitment to the development of a locally controlled higher education institution, strong scholarly promise, a sense of the importance of community-oriented applied research, and cross-cultural experience.

Three faculty positions are teaching positions. Applicants are needed for:

- English and Communications Skills (ESL desirable)
- Social Sciences
- Mathematics or Science (or a combination of both)
- Management

Qualifications

- Earned doctorate, ABD or terminal degree in Education or related field
- Ability to teach a wide spectrum of courses within area of expertise.
- Demonstrated interest and ability in community-oriented applied research.
- Demonstrated perspective/experience of interdisciplinary, cross-cultural, Native American or international interests/pursuits
- Classroom teaching experience
- Ability to meet the University of Alaska Fairbanks requirements for a faculty appointment.

The Fourth position is that of an Academic

Coordinator.

Qualifications

- Earned doctorate or ABD with significant experience in developing institutions, cross-cultural situations, and academic administrative experience.
- Interdisciplinary background in preferably more than one of the following areas: management, economics, resource development, education or an area of humanities, social science, international development and education.
- Ability to meet the University of Alaska-Fairbanks requirements for a faculty appointment.
- Demonstrated ability to work in cross-cultural situations, particularly with native American groups.

Desired Qualities for all positions:

- Experience with Alaskan Native People or other Native Americans.
- Prior experience with field based or distance delivered programs in rural cross-cultural settings.
- Interest in learning the Inupiat language and actively participating in the sociocultural activities of the Inupiat communities.
- Experience in counseling students.
