

Applications for Naval Reserve Officers Now Being Accepted

Applications for the Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps (NROTC) Navy-Marine Scholar-

ship Program are now being accepted.

The program is open to both male and female, and offers financial aid for four years in college. The Navy pays tuition and education fees, books, uniforms and \$100 per month spending money.

The purpose of the program is to provide civilian-educated officers to serve the American people in the U.S. Navy and Marine Corps.

Upon successfully completing baccalaureate degree requirements and completing summer training periods, students are commissioned officers in the regular Navy or Marine Corps.

Applications for the program will be considered, based on scores contained on either the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT)

of the College Entrance Examination Board, or the American College Test (ACT) of the American College Testing Program.

Applicants for the 1973 NROTC Navy-Marine Scholarship Program must: Apply for and take either the SAT or ACT Test at their own expense prior to November 30, 1972.

Arrange with the appropriate testing agency for the submission of their scores to the NROTC Navy-Marine Scholarship Program, Princeton, N.J.; and apply for the program before November 1, 1972.
