Canadian Fish Vessel Seized

JUNEAU — A Canadian vessel has been seized and her captain arrested for allegedly fishing in Alaskan waters some 20 miles south of Hyder in the Portland Canal, Governor William A Feas said

Portland Canal, Governor William A. Egan said.

He said Attorney General John E. Havelock's office asked the Superior Court in Ketchikan for a large fine plus confiscation and forfeiture of the \$20,000 vessel, all her gear and fish.

Vessel Captain Masato Nishi pleaded innocent to a charge under state statutes prohibiting certain alien activities and bail

certain alien activities and bail was set at \$10,000.

was set at \$10,000.

Superior Court Judge Hubert
Gilbert ordered the vessel and
all its gear to be held in state
custody until the completion of

legal proceedings.
Egan said Frank Sharp, district officer of the state fish trict officer of the state fish and wildlife protection division, and three aides saw the vessel Karen West of Vancouver, B.C., early Monday morning approximately three-fourths of a mile inside the American border fishing without lights or gear markings.

The state officers had taken

markings.

The state officers had taken a ship into the area the preceding evening to investigate reports of Canadian fishing violations in the Toombstone Bay area, some two miles north of Breezy Point, the Governor said said.

He said maneuvering by the state ship blocked an attempt of the Canadian vessel to flee with her nets still out, after which the captain obeyed orders to

In making the seizure and escorting the ship to Ketchikan, the four protection officers went without sleep for 44 hours, Egan said.

Alaska Veterans Get Increases

JUNEAU, ALASKA July 24, 1972 — Approximately 2500 Alaska veterans with military service connected disabilities will receive a 10 percent cost of living increase in their September checks, according to Mr. Harley D. Anders, Director of the Veterans Administration Regional Office, Juneau, Alaska.

Mr. Anders stressed the in-

Mr. Anders stressed the increase will be paid automatically

crease will be paid automatically and eligible veterans need not contact the VA to receive it.

"With the 10 percent increase, a 50 percent disabled single veteran's compensation would go from \$135 to \$149 a month a 100 percent disabled single veteran would receive

a month a 100 percent disabled single veteran would receive \$495 monthly instead of \$450," the VA director explained. Married veterans with dis-abilities rated 50 percent or higher will also get a 10 per-cent hike in their dependency

In addition, the increase provides a \$150 a year clothing allowance for veterans who wear prosthetic devices because of service connected disabilities, if these devices tend to wear or

these devices tend to wear or tear clothing. Still another provision of the new law makes peacetime veterans eligible for compenveterans eligible for compensation at the same rate as war-time veterans, instead of the 80 percent of the wartime rate which has been in effect for 40 years. However, this equalization provision will not go into effect until July 1, 1973.

"Compensation is paid to veterans whose injuries or diwho were incurred in line of duty or aggravated by it, and who were discharged or separated under other than dishonorable conditions," Mr. Anders said. ders said.
