

Postponed AFN Board Meet Re-scheduled

The Alaska Federation of Natives Board of Directors meeting has now been scheduled for August 11-12 in Anchorage and it will be held in the Kaloa Building.

The meeting was originally scheduled to be held in Fairbanks on August 3-4 but it was cancelled at the last minute due to lack of quorum of the board

members.

The principal business to be transacted will be to outline the courses of action by the AFN concerning Native Land Claims and discussion of the agenda of the statewide conference scheduled for October 5-6 in Fairbanks.

Other proposals like the native leadership training will be discussed. The board will also discuss the implementation of planning grants and training program for native leadership and economic development proposals.

The statewide conference of the AFN has been planned to coincide with the Tundra Times 6th Anniversary Banquet to be held on October 5.

About 250 native leaders from all corners of the state will attend the banquet. The Tanana Chiefs and the Fairbanks Native Association have also made plans to meet around the banquet date.

The Kodiak Area Native Association has volunteered to send up 500 pounds of king crab as the main bill of fare for the banquet. There are tentative plans to send for 150 pounds of prime reindeer meat from Nome that will be made into stew.

The location for the banquet has not been procured as yet but the Tundra Times banquet committee will start work on this and other matters shortly after the World Eskimo Olympics now underway are over.
