The indictment alleges that Cooley, 45, of 525 E. Baseline Road, Mesa, Arizona, earned 818,912 in 1968, \$17,214 in 1969 and \$19,083 in 1970.

(An individual was required to file income tax returns in 1968 and 1969 if his income exceeded \$600. In 1970 the requirements called for returns if an individual's income ex-ceeded \$1,700 or \$2,300 for a person entitled to file joint tax returns.)

The United States Govern-ent filed "Information" ment ment filed "Information" charges against Cooley on June 23, 1972, for the 1968 through 1970 years. On October 30, 1972, Cooley appeared for for mal arraignment before the U.S. Judge Walter E. Craig.

Cooley contended he was cing a \$300,000 fine and/or facing a three years in prison without a Grand Jury indictment. As a result, the Federal Grand Jury
