Another important aspect of the decision is the effect it will have on foreign fishing entry into Cook Inlet. The area traditionally has been considered by the state as inland water and therefore closed to foreign fishing. The Supreme Court now will

consider the arguments and is expected to reach a decision, which will be final, in the next few months.

U.S. Sen. Ted Stevens attended the oral arguments Wednesday and afterwards said he was very hopeful that the judgement for the State of Alaska would not be overturned.

'It's clear in this case, as it has "It's clear in this case, as it has been in the two previous court decisions on this question, that the state has all rights to possession of the resources of the Lower Cook Inlet and that this land is not part of the Outer Continental Shelf," Stevens said. "It is imperative that Alaska receive a favorable Supreme Court

receive a favorable Supreme Court decision to allow the state to protect the rights of Alaskan fishermen against foreign encroachment on Alaskan fisheries resources," the senator wid said.
