The two seamount chains border the Sedna Fracture Zone, a deep chasm in the ocean bottom. They consist of a high ridge directly north of the zone and a second lower ridge further to the north.

It was estimated that the new discoveries lie about 450 to 500 miles north of the Mendocino Fracture Zone, a major undersea feature in the northeast

It has been estimated that there are some 10,000 seamounts in the Pacific. Much of the area is still largely unex-plored in detail, say most of the authorities, and existing maps show these features are drawn from unreliable information.

Analysis of the data was supported by the National Science Foundation as part of the scabed assessment program of the International Decade of Ocean Exploration.
