NOTICE OF UTILITY TARIFF FILING

The ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION hereby gives notice that UNITED UTILITIES, INC. (United), a telecommunications utility, has filed a tariff revision (TA3-249) which is a proposal to "unbundle" (divide into separate components) its rates. United made this filing in response to a Commission order implementing a series of Federal Communications Commission decisions that require all local exchange telephone utilities to unbundle their rates for telephone service and file tariff revisions with state commissions showing a separate charge for the telephone instruments.

A summary of some of the present and proposed residential monthly charges for all exchanges follows.

United also proposes to charge those customers with touch calling instruments \$.80 per month for that service.

In addition United proposes to (1) add definitions of access line, access line charge, basic equipment, equipment, equipment charge, inside wiring, inside wiring charge, instrument connection and surcharge, and (2) delete several key telephone equipment items.

If after investigation the Commission finds a rate or classification different from that proposed by United is reasonable, the Commission may approve a rate or classification which varies from that proposed.

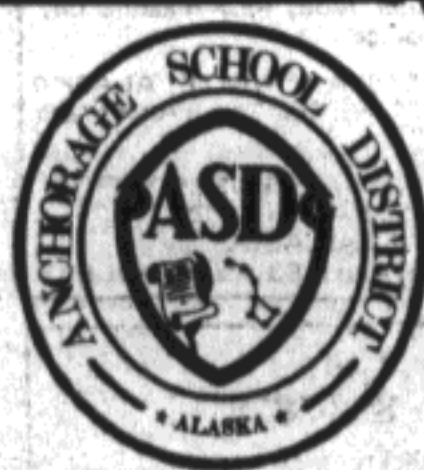
