

Murkowski on Indian Affairs Committee

Sen. Frank Murkowski has been named to serve on the Senate's Select Committee on Indian Affairs, which has jurisdiction over legislation dealing with the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA), the Indian Health Service and various Alaska Native housing programs.

"I'm pleased to be selected to serve on this committee and look forward to working on legislation of particular interest to Alaska Natives," said Murkowski.

The committee is also

charged with conducting studies of matters pertaining to problems and opportunities of Indians, including land management and trust responsibilities, Indian education, health, special services and loan programs.

According to Murkowski, the Select Committee is expected
