These products are incorrectly formulated and potentially harmful for infants. The imitation low-fat dry milk have legal requirements of the Inlegal requirements of the Infant Formula Act of 1980 for infant formula.

The following programs, by law, do not allow substitutions of imitation products for the dairy group requirements of



the daily diet: Women-Infant, and children — W.I.C.; School Food Service; and Older Alaskan's Commission Nutrition Programs. Read the labels of the product, and protect yourself from low quality imitation milk.
