

Gaddie runs for House

Alan Gaddie, an Anchorage school teacher and small businessman, has declared his candidacy for State House Seat B in District 13.

Gaddie moved to Anchorage seven years ago to work with the University of Alaska and the Anchorage Community College in counselling job placement and career planning. In 1981, he left the University to accept a position as a substitute teacher with the Anchorage School District. He is also co-owner and manager of a local tutoring service.

Gaddie says that Alaskans deserve better representation than what we have been getting in Juneau. "When you consid-

er the amount of time and money your legislators are spending in Juneau, you'd think you'd get better representation. But you don't, and as far as I'm concerned the current Legislature has a long way to go before they deserve the pay raise they just gave themselves."

Gaddie wants to give the people of District 13 the type of representation that they deserve — instead of the type of representation that they have been forced to accept.

Key issues that Gaddie plans to stress include Education, Public Safety and Ethics.
