Brooks, Commissioner, Department of Fish and Game; the Limited Entry Fishing Staff; Charle's Meacham, Director, International Fisheries; Walt Parker, Commissioner, Department of Highways; Representative Terry Gardiner and many others.

"We are expecting a lot of people who are interested in, and concerned about, one of our largest renewable resources and employer—our fisheries."
