The Department of Natural Resources, Division of Oil and Gas (DO&G), gives formal notice under AS 38.05.945(a) (4) of its intention to offer lands for competitive oil and gas lease. Proposed Sale 48 includes 104 tracts with an area of approximately 526,101 acres. The proposed sale area consists of onehore acreage near the Kuparuk River south of the Kuparuk oil field, on Alaska's North Slope. The entire sale area is within the North Slope Borough. Nuigsut is the only community in the vicinity of the sale area.

Proposed Sale 48A includes 11 tracts with an area of approximately 42,053 acres. The proposed sale area consists of onshore and offshore acreage near Nikkelsen Bay and Foggy Island Bay on Alaska's North Slope and in the Beaufort Sea. This acreage was previously leased in state oil and gas lease sales 14 and 23 and was formerly included in the West Mikkelsen Unit. These leases expired on December 31, 1985. The entire sale area is within the North Slope Borough.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME

Notice is hereby given that the Alaska Department of Fish and Game, under authority vested by AS 16.50.020 and AS 16.05.870, proposes to adopt, amend or repeal regulation in Title 5 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with waters important for the spawning, rearing or migration of anadromous fish, which implement, interpret or make specific the provisions of AS 16.05.870.

The Department may adopt, amend, repeal or take no action on the subject matter of the proposed regulatory changes listed in the following informative summary.

The Department proposes to adopt, amend, repeal

or take no action on the Catalog of Waters Important for the Spawning, Rearing or Migration of Anadromous Fishes, and the Atlas to the Catalog of Waters Important for the Spawning, Rearing or Migration of Anadromous Fishes. The six volume atlas is a compilation of topographic maps, scale 1:63,360 or 1:250,000, upon which are disignated in accordance with AS 16.05.870(a), the various rivers, lakes or streams, or parts of them, that are important for the spawning, rearing or migration of anadromous fish. The catalog sets forth legal descriptions for the mouth of each steam, river or lake designated on the maps in the atlas, as well as assigns to each stream, river or take a unique identification number. The atlas and the catalog have the effect of identifying the waters for which a person or agency must first notify the Commissioner of Fish and Game, in accordancee with AS 16.05.870(b), before undertaking to construct a hydraulic project or use, divert, obstruct, pollute or change the natural flow or bed of a specified river, lake or stream, or use wheeled, tracked, or excavating equipment or log dragging equipment in the bed of a river, take or stream set forth in the atlas or the catalog.

The atlas and the catalog also set forth information regarding permit application requirements, a user's guide to the atlas and catalog, an explanation of the unique stream, river and lake numbering system, sources of information contained in the atles or the catalog, limitations of the information in the atlas or the catalog, updating procedures, definitions of terms, and other information or requirements to implement, interpret or make specific the provisions of AS 16.05.870.
