That's been one of his obs for years and helped earn him college funds this summer in addition to serving as a tourist guide to the isolated village.

Sheldon also admits the whale seal and caribou meat is missed as a food. "I could get tired of hamburgers, pretty quick." Sheldon replies to the all-American favorite in the lower 48 states.

A 3.3 grade average student in high school in Kotzebue, Sheldon became acquainted with the college 3,000 miles from home through its Kotzebue cen ter where he took a course in music fundamentals taught by program director Roy Clark.

Now majoring in music education Sheldon says he picked George Fox because of its "strong music program and Christian emphasis" and has found another bonus here young people his age.

In Kotzebue where his father is a power plant operator and his family helps hunt and fish for food, Sheldon did not have the company of as many friends his age as he is finding now where he is surrounded by 480 nearly his age.
