

Judges Picked For Poetry Contest

Judges for the University of Alaska Festival of Arts Poetry Contest have been announced.

Dr. Emile Martel and Prof. James Hadra of the University's Department of Linguistics and Foreign Languages and the Rev. Oliver Everette, lecturer in the Department of English and Poet Laureate of Alaska, will judge the contest.

Winners will be announced Wednesday, April 13 during "An Evening of Poetry" beginning at 7:30 p.m. in the Upper Commons on the University campus.

The poetry contest is one of the highlights of the Festival of Arts, scheduled from April 7-14. Awards of \$50 will be made for the best poems in the student and non-student categories, and three awards of \$25, \$15 and \$10 will be given for the top three poems in the children's category.

The children's division is open to poets not older than a junior high school student. Anyone enrolled in University courses during either semester of the 1965-66 school year, in other Alaskan colleges, or in any secondary school in Alaska, public or private, may enter in the student division.

Members of any school faculty who may also be part-time students are permitted to enter in the non-student class only.

Poets have until April 4 to enter poems in the contest. Entries should be sent to the College of Arts and Letters, University of Alaska, College. Information is available by calling 479-7256 or writing the College of Arts and Letters.
