Federal Subsistence Board issues new regulations for public review

The Federal Subsistence Board has published proposed July 1, 1996, to June 30, 1997, federal subsistence regulations for public review. The proposed regulations identify customary and traditional use determinations, open seasons, harvest limits, and methods and means of harvesting wildlife for subsistence on federal public lands in Alaska.

Written proposals to change these regulations will be accepted by the Board through October 27, 1995.

Copies of the proposed 1996-1997 regulations and forms for submitting proposed changes were mailed to individuals and organizations throughout the state during the last week of August. Advisory Councils will meet during September and October to
consider the proposed regulations,
develop proposals to change these
regulations, and hear public comment. The Regional Councils represent the Southeast, Southcentral,
Kodiak/Aleutian Islands, Bristol
Bay, Yukon-Kuskokwim Delta,
Western Interior, Seward Peninsula, Northwest Arctic, Eastern
Interior, and North Slope regions.
