

# Self-employed Man Guilty

JUNEAU—A self-employed Fairbanks man was found guilty of three counts of making false statements to obtain unemployment compensation after entering a plea of nolo contendere in Fairbanks District Court.

Judge Arthur Robson, Jr. fined Alfred Skondovitch \$75 and sentenced him to 60 days in jail. The jail term was suspended on the condition that he repay \$119 to the Employment Security Division of the Department of Labor. The trial was held on June 24.

According to the Labor Department, Skondovitch operated a business and did not report his income while drawing unemployment compensation benefits.
