Point Hope Pastor Vincent dies May 14 in Anchorage

Roy K. Vincent served as an assistant pastor at the Episcopal Church in Point Hope for many years. He also worked with the state sanitation department before his retirement. He was a member of the Alaska Territorial Guard. He was a shareholder of Tigara Village Corporation and the Arctic Slope Regional Corp. He resided in the North Slope Borough.

Mr. Vincent, 81, died May 14, 1989, at Providence Hospital. He was born July 13, 1907, at Hershel Island, Canada and grew up in Point Hope.

At one time he was a whaling captain who had one whale to his credit. He was also a former village council president of Old Point Hope. A very quiet and humble person, he was loved and respected by everyone he knew. He always smiled and welcomed everyone. In addition to hunting, camping and fishing, he enjoyed

Christian music.

Mr. Vincent leaves five daughters, Molly Oktollik of Point Hope, Flora File of Juneau, Martha Burt and Millie Neher of Anchorage and Annie Ross of Homer; one son, Lloyd Vincent of Point Hope; four stepdaughters, Alice Weber of Point Hope, Madeline Carl of Spokane, Wash., Dora Cown of Thornton, Colo., and Viola Norton of Noatak; a stepson, Andrew Tooyak of Point Hope; one brother, Patrick Attungana of Point Hope, one first cousin, Lily Walker of Nome; 38 grandchildren; 23 great grandchildren and many nieces and nephews.

A memorial service was conducted according to his wishes in Anchorage on May 18 at All Saints Episcopal Church with the Rev. Norman H.V. Elliott officiating. Burial mass will be conducted at Point Hope.
