

## CORPORATIONS BRIEFS

**ST. GEORGE** --St. George Tanaq, the St. George Island village corporation has received an additional 1,000 metric ton allocation for Pacific cod from the North Pacific Fisheries Management Council. The cod will be shipped to Taiwan in a joint venture with Highly Enterprises. As part of the agreement, the Taiwanese firm will provide fishing experience and training for as many as 10 members of the St. George community.

**ANCHORAGE** -- Sealaska

Shareholders in Anchorage have planned their regular potluck meeting for 5:30 p.m. April 24 at the Pioneer School in Anchorage. Committees will deliver their reports during the meeting. Members are asked to bring along a main dish, salad or desert.

**KETCHIKAN**--The Saxman City Council has asked the Ketchikan Gateway Borough to relinquish about 400 acres of Native burial ground the larger

city has claimed on nearby Pen-nock Island. 'So far the Ketchikan borough assembly has deferred action on the request until the city's planning department can assemble a map with the gravesites identified. The burial ground falls within lands the city has claimed in state land transfers. The Saxman council had asked that the land be relinquished to protect existing graves and to allow continued use of the area as a burial ground.
