The ALASKA PUBLIC UTILI-
TIES COMMISSION hereby gives
notice that NORTH STATE TELE-
PHONE CO., INC., (North State) a
telecommunications utility, has filed
a tariff revision (TA-83) consisting
a revised schedules A-1, A-3 and
A-4. The proposed revision of
Schedule A-1 would increase the
private line business rate from \$21
per month at present to \$30 per
month; each business extension
telephone from \$3.50 per month at
present to \$5.50 per month; and
each residence extension telephone
from \$2.50 per month at present to
\$3.50 per month. The revision to
Schedule A-3 which sets forth the
mileage rates would change the
mileage increments from 1/4 mile to
1/8 mile as a basis for charge, and
also change the measurement method
from airline distance to cable pair
distance. The revision to Schedule
A-4 would increase the public pay
telephone charge from 10 cents per
call to 25 cents per call.

The utility states that the tariff
revisions is necessary if full-time
maintenance is to be provided at the
Kotzebue exchange. It requests the
Commission to grant immediate ap-
proval of the rate increase on an
emergency basis. North State
estimates its total annual revenue
requirement for the Kotzebue
System to be \$196,750; the local
service rates with the proposed
changes would yield \$65,091 an-
nually, and toll revenues would
produce \$131,659. More detailed

(1) 19 AAC 30.040(c) is amended
to require the applications for shared
revenues shall be returned to the
Department postmarked not later
than October 15 of the entitlement
year.

(2) 19 AAC 30.060 is amended
by redefining the method of deter-
mining the population estimates to
conform to provisions of legislation
adopted during the second session
of the Eighth Alaska Legislature and
to provide that estimates of popu-
lation offered by boroughs may be
conclusive as to determinations of
population for all constituent cities.

(3) 19 AAC 30.070(a) is amended
by clarification of the reference to
"public accountants" in audit re-
quirements imposed by AS 29.48,
220, by defining that term with
respect to professional licensing
requirements.

(4) 19 AAC 30.090(a) is amended
by defining the amount of shared
revenue payable as a prepayment.

(5) 19 AAC 30.090(b) is amended
by allowing remission of prepayment

(6) 19 AAC 30.090(c) is repealed.
(7) 19 AAC 30.090(d) is amended
by revising definitions relating to
the scope of municipal assistance in
support of public parks and re-
creation programs of facilities.

by adding a new subsection spec-
ifying minimal levels of police
protection services.
